

# **SCHOOL BOARD**

The Term 3 School Board meeting was held on Monday 13th September 2021. The Agenda included:

- ⇒ A review of the *School Board Training Module 3* which covers —identifying the long-term priorities and targets of the school, planning to achieve targets, reviewing budgets that support business/strategic planning and developing a school plan.
- ⇒ The Term 3 School Business Plan Progress Update including the Successes and Challenges in the different focus areas:
  - ♦ Literacy & Numeracy— Final diagnostic data is being gathered for the 2018—2020 Business Plan School review which takes place in Term 1 of 2022
  - ♦ ICT—Policy has been updated, an equipment audit has been completed and replacement of 15 IPads and 38 Computers have been ordered.
  - ♦ Year 10 students have continued with their Work Placements with good feedback from employers.
  - ♦ New Student Leaders visited the Mayor of Mandurah.
  - ♦ The Sustainability 2018—2020 report data has revealed we are improving efforts in waste management.
  - ♦ Gretchen Lee will take on the role of Sustainability 2IC.
  - Our teachers are excited about how to teach sustainability in an innovative way with a new Scope and Sequence being developed.
  - ♦ Staff selection processes have been completed (see new staff above).
  - ♦ All staff have now completed Team Teach and Manual Handling training and two aspirant leaders have enrolled into a Launch into Leadership course.
  - ♦ Fortnightly Positive Education teacher meetings have continued.
  - $\Diamond$  Therapy review team are reviewing processes .
- $\Rightarrow$  A Discussion workshop on the 2022—2025 Strategic Plan.

# **YEAR 7.1**

### Mrs Leah Booher

### Literacy:

In literacy this term, students are continuing their personalized reading and spelling programs and are seeing improvement in themselves which is exciting! As a class, we are learning about nouns including common, proper, and pronouns. We are also looking at verbs and adjectives and how to use them properly in a sentence. The students are also developing a research paper on a country of their choice. One of the requirements for the paper is to type the paper on a laptop. Therefore, the class has begun



typing lessons. Students login into their accounts and follow the typing program. The program corrects their errors and gives them their accuracy and speed. Students are doing an excellent job and progressing their typing which will help them in the future for composing emails, writing reports, and just a general great skill to have in life. The typing program is completed three times a week with 15-minute practice.



### **Numeracy:**

This semester we have continued to have two math groups that work simultaneously at different tables. Both groups come in and begin their mental math warm-up books to get their brains ready for mathematics class. The red table is currently working on identifying fractions and the ability to split the objects into halves, quarters and eights. The students are continuing to progress in skip counting in two's, five's, and ten's up to 120 and recognizing patterns in number sequences. They are learning how to

compare the length, height, and width of objects using informal units and are working on their statistics and probability with the ability to plot a simple bar graph.

The blue table is currently working on finding equivalent fractions and reducing fractions to the lowest form and completing symmetry grid work on graph paper. The students are comparing and ordering unit

fractions and locating them on a number line and investigating strategies to solve problems involving addition and subtraction with fractions of the same denominator. The blue table is also learning to construct and receive information from column, bar, line graphs and pie charts.

The students are getting excited about the upcoming visit from the year 6's who are looking to transition to HHCESC next year! They are enthusiastic to see some old friends and tell them how great it is in secondary school!



# **YEAR 7.2**

### **Dr Stephen Enoma**

**Literacy:** Students have been engaged in a wide range of learning activities within their individual ability levels, these include spelling and participation in daily reading comprehension lessons. Many are receiving one-on-one literacy intervention weekly under our MultiLit program. This consists of each student, working individually with a staff member on their phonics and phonemes (Word Attack) to develop the skills of decoding, sight words to enrich their vocabulary, and reading a wide range of texts (you learn to read by reading). Daily, the Year 7 students participated in guided reading and reading comprehension sessions to improve their speaking and listening skills. They have had opportunities to write imaginative texts (providing prompts as needed) and shared their work with the rest of the class.



Numeracy: Students are working regularly on their mental maths competence and times table. These multiplication lessons are essential to their grasping of the concept of sharing (Division) which will be covered



later this semester. Students have also had ample opportunities to consolidate on topics they have learned earlier covering the Number and Algebra Measurement strands. Students have deepened their understanding of number sense through exposure to the concepts of 'commutative', 'associative', and 'distributive' laws/properties of numbers. For example, they now know that when adding or multiplying numbers, it does not matter which way the numbers are arranged, the result is the same.

**Science:** The area of science covered this term was *Physical Sciences*. Under this theme students built electrical circuits and investigated objects that conduct electricity and those that do not. They also explored the concepts of "light" and "light dispersion". Using a glass prism, light box,

filters, and screen, students were elated to find that, the seemingly 'white' light is actually made up of Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo, and Violet colours.

**HASS:** The focus of our HASS program this term is Indigenous Australians with a particular interest in the Aboriginal people. Students have taken a project approach to peeling back the layers of time, digging deep into Australian history concerning the nature of contacts between Aboriginal people and the Europeans and the impacts that these interactions had on the environment and people's lives. It has been a great and exciting learning journey for all.







# **YEAR 6 TRANSITION**

The Year 6 Primary School students had the opportunity this term, to look around our school and the mainstream campus to see what facilities both schools have to offer. Even though the weather wasn't in our favour, it didn't dampen the student's excitement and enthusiasm whilst dodging the showers and trying to keep dry during the tour. The experience proved to be successful with the students asking lots of questions and their eagerness to come back for another visit. Literacy: In English this term, students are focusing on persuasive texts. We've looked at some examples, and analysed the text structure of a persuasive text before the students wrote their own. Some examples were Bejay's piece titled 'Children should not fight at school' and Jacob's piece titled 'Mobile phones should be allowed in class'. In other areas of Literacy, students have worked on their individual reading comprehension programs and writing and grammar skills. Numeracy: we have studied two topics so far this term-

Place Value and Addition. Our students work in small groups for maths, working at their own level with a hands on approach. In Year 8/9.1 we are also learning about 'Cells' this term in Science, with students using the microscopes to look at animal cells close up. In HASS we are looking at the growth in the global population and investigating the impact this has on the environment. 


# **YEAR 8/9.2**

**Literacy**: In English this term, students created a persuasive writing piece. Whilst writing the piece students focused on expanding their vocabulary, finding their voice, and following their passions to persuade the audience and convince them to agree with us! Each week we watch BTN episodes, keeping us up to date with the outside world. After the episode, we test our knowledge and comprehension through fun quizzes!

**Numeracy:** In Maths, we are focussing on improving our sense of number by completing number of the day activities! Each maths lesson brings different skills and areas to focus on. We also complete our weekly shopping and spending tracker every Friday afternoon!





**Science:** We learnt about the Sun, Earth & the Moon. We looked at the difference between day and night as well as the roles these 3 elements play in our system and lives. We experimented with our shadows and look forward to learning more about the world we live in!

HASS: In HASS &
Sustainability, we are now responsible for completing the school recycling process on Tuesday afternoons. We collect rubbish around the school, empty and sort through recycling bins as

well as determine which class earns the weekly recycling award! We have also learnt about the 3 R's – Reduce, Reuse & Recycle.

Each student is setting weekly learning & personal goals and working hard towards achieving them by the end of the week! So far, each student has achieved at least one set goal and we are extremely proud of their efforts!

All of us now take part in weekly class meetings where students have been showing their levels of maturity in contributing towards a positive class environment. We are

working towards being a kind, caring, and friendly class who work hard and treat others with respect.







# **YEAR 8/9.3**

**Literacy:** In English this term, the Year 8/9's have enjoyed the weekly writing sessions, where they put their creative skills to the test. Some of the tasks they've completed were designing a cruise ship, theme park, and city. Students also spent time researching fictional characters during these sessions preparing for the Literacy event of Literacy/Numeracy week. Another weekly task the students do is watch BTN and complete related activities surrounding the news stories presented. Many of the stories they watched revolve around renewable energy, which linked well with their sustainability classes. On top of this, the Year 8/9's participated in visual literacy lessons, where they analyse interesting, thought-provoking images.

Numeracy: The students have worked on their multiplication skills. They complete daily timetable activities to advance their ability to multiply numbers. Students have also developed their maths skills

by regularly playing Monopoly, Uno, Finska, and card challenges. The class has also set up shop, where the Year 8/9's earn "money" to spend on items at the shop.

HASS/ Sustainability: During Humanities this semester, the Year 8/9's have learnt about how our school recycles. Our class audited the general waste bins (green bins), checking and transferring any recyclable materials to the correct containers. Along with this, the students researched and brainstormed how to make everyday items/tasks more sustainable. For example, some of the





students have investigated how to make their packed lunches more sustainable. It has been interesting to see the ideas they have had with this.

**Science:** In Science this term, the students have explicitly looked at friction and how it works. They've enjoyed conducting related science experiments such as using a pencil to pick up a jar of rice and pushing various materials down a slope, recording what they see. Another

experiment was to create a Ferris Wheel out of pop sticks and, in turn, learn about how necessary friction is when operating one. Many students consider science their favourite subject.







# YEAR 10 BUSINESS ENTERPRISE

In Business Enterprise during term 3, students have been focusing on their own enterprise which they will be selling at the Christmas stall next term. However, in order to be able to sell their items, our students had to give a short presentation to "sell" their idea to a secret panel of judges. The business enterprise students also took a trip to the local shopping centre to purchase the resources needed to make a 'prototype' to show and display during their presentation. This allowed them to practise their social skills, mathematics in dealing with money and change, and planning skills as they helped in planning how to get there and back using public transport.

The business team have also had opportunities to review their performance in the café and office enterprises and see the progress they have made since the beginning of the year. These enterprises are predominantly run by the students, where each week a team leader is appointed and they will run through the jobs which need to be done and lead the debrief at the beginning of period 3.

This term has shown the business students take autonomy in the running of the office and café enterprises, as well as plan, create, and deliver a presentation to sell their own item ahead at the Christmas stall next term!



# YEAR 10 ECO LEADERS



In English, our class has taken on an "around the world" theme. Where over the term, each student has chosen a country that they


would personally like to visit and have been researching its geography, history, fashion, culture and food. At the end of term, our class will be presenting a traditional dish from that country to share with each other.



# HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

### Year 7

The focus this term for the Year 7's is on human growth from a baby to an elderly person and identifying the physical, mental, social, and emotional changes that occur during this time, especially during puberty

The students are also developing five sensory gardens, exploring the sounds, sights, smells, touches and tastes that surround them each day. Students planted a variety of foods in the tasting garden, to care for, harvest, and eventually prepare healthy food that will enhance their own growth.

### Year 8

Years 8 students are learning about growth and the many changes that can be experienced during puberty. These physical, mental, social and emotional changes were explored through videos, reading books and engaging in many class discussions. Students summarised the ways that they can cope with the changes during puberty and also filmed interviews with their peers, exploring the many fun aspects of using Bookcreator on their iPads.

### Year 9

This term the Year 9 students are focusing on the way their bodies are changing both physically and mentally during puberty and how they can successfully navigate these changes with the help of knowledge, understanding and help from reliable sources.

Whole class and small group discussions have allowed students to share experiences, ideas and challenges while developing knowledge, resilience and healthy relationships.

The year nines are a vibrant and enthusiastic group of students whose discussions are often filled with great ideas, questions and solutions.
