Our classroom Theme for Term 1 is focussed on Humanities and Social Sciences — Democracy.



Centrelink Family Health Care Card – card holder must be parent/guardian. Claims cannot be made by a parent using a student's card (ie: the student may hold a card for disability purposes)

Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card – Student name should be listed on the card

Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

The allowance consists of two components:

\$115.00 Clothing allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian. \$235.00 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.
