COVID—19 UPDATE

Asymptomatic close contact protocols

Very high caseload settings

Students in school or early childcare, who have been identified as a close contact but are asymptomatic:



Can attend school, before school care and after school care



Can travel between home and school with family – avoid public transport unless no alternative available



Can attend schoolbased sporting, cultural training or school events at their school



Must isolate at all other times until 7 days has passed.

If students become unwell, they should stay at home and get tested.

These settings do not apply to students who are household close contacts — in this case, students will need to isolate for seven days and follow the regular close contact protocols.

YEAR 7.1

Mrs Leah Booher

It has been a fantastic start in 7.1. We have five boys and four girls in the room and the energy levels are quite even, making it a very positive environment.

ENGLISH - This term has seen us engaging in individualised reading and spelling programs, learning the definitions of words and how to use them in a sentence. We have been learning how to write a persuasive text using the correct structure and understanding the difference between opinion and fact. Each student is writing their own persuasive text to present to classmates. Typing has been a popular lesson this term, everyone is following the typing program and progressing at their own pace. The typing program is completed three

times a week for 15 min and will help in the future with composing emails and writing reports.

MATHS - We have learned about Place Value and Addition, focusing on how to rename numbers and use MBA blocks to represent numbers. We do this through completing hands-on activities within groups who work simultaneously at different tables. All groups come in and begin their mental math warm-up books to get their brains ready for mathematics class.

SCIENCE – Force and motion has been one of our focus topics so far this term, we have explored how push and pull motions are used in everyday life to move things. We have investigated how force and motion is used by toys that spin, roll, tilt and bounce. We have carried out experiments to measure what effect the surface of the floor has on the distance that a toy car will roll off a ramp.

HASS– The ancient country of Egypt was our focus this term in HASS. Everyone has really enjoyed learning about Egypt and all of its secrets, in particular the mummification process and writing their names in hieroglyphics! One of the fun activities the students participated in was wrapping each other up like mummies! They also made a shaduf in STEM, cooked Egyptian flat bread and mummified a piece of apple!

Everyone is working very hard to earn keys. Keys are given to students who demonstrate organisation, persistence, getting along, resilience and confidence throughout the school day. At the end of every week, I draw out three winners who earn ten minutes of reward time. Reward time options include walking to the chickens, iPads, basketball, building and free time.

At the end of Term 1 we have booked the HHC Lecture Theatre and will be watching a movie on the big screen! We are currently in the process of brainstorming possible movie and lunch options for this special day for making it through Term One!





YEAR 7.2

What a great start to Term 2 and 2022! Everyone has settled into high school and are enjoying making new social connections. Students are becoming familiar with the class rules, and looking forward to the range of fun subjects that they will learn each day. It has been wonderful to see their independence grow, from catching the bus to and from school and purchasing food from the canteen.

ENGLISH— We have focused on Persuasive Texts, including points of view, what it means to be for or against and how to tell the difference between facts and opinions. Students are working towards creating their own persuasive texts using some of the language features that make a strong, convincing argument. We will conclude the term by presenting a text to a small group. Typing practice is undertaken each week during English, it has been fantastic to see the progress that has already been achieved this year, with students placing their fingers on the keyboard correctly and using a mouse to control the computers.

MATHS – In Term 1 we have concentrated on learning about place value, addition and subtraction. This has seen us practice counting collections and recognising numbers. We have developed an understanding of 'one more' and 'one less' by using number lines and connecting blocks. An understanding of addition and subtraction has been achieved in class by modelling a variety of addition and subtraction problems with concrete materials.

SCIENCE- We have undertaken many hands-on learning activities and experiments! Force and motion, gravity and air resistance have been the focus areas explored, with in class experiments including recording slow motion

footage of domino chains toppling to see how gravity pulls them to the floor and measuring what effect the surface of the floor has on the distance that a toy car will roll off a ramp. In STEM we followed instructions to make a variety of paper planes and then furthered this activity by designing our own paper plane based on our favourite design.

HASS- In HASS we learned all about Ancient Egypt, including the Ancient Egyptian way of life, farming, food and writing. We have made Egyptian flatbread, posters showing the Nile River and dials to show the Ancient

Egyptian seasons and written messages in hieroglyphics.

Students have practiced preparing simple meals like cereal in the life skills room. They have enjoyed learning about hygiene, preparing food safely and most of all eating their carefully prepared meals!

Everyone has worked hard to earn key tokens in class by demonstrating organisation, persistence, getting along,

resilience and confidence. Each week we would draw out two winners who earn ten minutes' free time. Free time activities include playing basketball, Minecraft or games.

As a class, we are working hard to earn one hundred class tokens. A token is given out each time the teachers can see that the whole class is working hard. When we reach one hundred, we will earn a movie with snacks.







ECOLEADERS



They found these projects engaging and have learned valuable persuasive skills they can take with them beyond school.


MATHS- The Year 8s have been developing their understanding of Place Value. Through the Top 10 Program. We have undertaken fun activities, including taking photos of numbers around the school and playing a very social yet sensibly competitive Place Value card game. In addition, we have used Kahoot (an online quiz platform) when doing Maths drills, which everyone found both fun and engaging. On top of this, the class has employed a weekly in-house shop, where the students can use pretend money, earnt through the week through good behaviour, to buy fun items.

SCIENCE—Fun, energy—related experiments has made Science the most popular learning area this term, as the Year 8s are able to tap into their natural curiosity about how things work. The Balloon Rocket activity which demonstrated how energy is transferred from one space to the next was a huge hit!

HASS- This term HASS was taught by Mrs Hardy who took the students on a wonderful journey of what life was like in the middle ages. Hands-on learning activities including roleplaying (in full costume) occupations and tasks undertaken during the middle ages and building related structures through art and crafts have been real highlights for the Year 8s.

Hello and Welcome to 8/9.1, it has been a great start to the 2022 school year. The students are adjusting well to their new classroom and peers and it has been great to see them forming new friendships with the people in their classroom, whilst still maintaining friendships from last year. As a new teacher to HHC ESC I have loved the caring community surrounding HHC ESC and am looking forward to seeing the progress and efforts of my students in all that they do and am very grateful to be a part of their education journey.

ENGLISH- Advertising and what it is all about how it impacts us and how successful advertisements are created has been our English focus this term. Students have had the opportunity to create their own advertisements and have made up imaginary products to try and sell to one another using successful advertising techniques identified in class.

MATHS- Hands-on materials and real-world examples have been used in class during lessons on place value, addition and subtraction. Everyone has been able to demonstrate their number skills and persistence during these activities.

SCIENCE - Heat Energy has been our Science focus for Term 1 which has seen us investigating all things warm and hot. As a class we have explored sources of heat energy and are gaining an understanding of the three types of heat energy being kinetic, chemical and electric energy.

HASS- Exploring Medieval Europe and the difference between life during the middle ages versus life now has seen as undertake some exciting learning activities during HASS this term, including building catapults. We have also been looking at the how different the food, clothing hygiene and social hierarchy was during this time and identifying how far things have advanced.

In class we have focused on learning about the five keys to success as

part of the You Can Do It Program and how we can put them into practice when undertaking daily tasks.

As a class when we demonstrate one of the five keys (resilience, persistance, team work, confidence and getting along) we have the opportunity to earn a group marble to add to the marble iar, when we achieve 100 marbles in the jar, we can have a pizza party!












YEAR 8/9.2

ENGLISH- In English, we have been learning about print & digital advertising! We have learnt about the various techniques and tricks that are used to persuade the target audience to buy products or pay for services. We have researched and discussed some of the biggest companies advertisements and analysed them as a group, it has been very interesting!

MATHS- For the first half of the term, we have learnt about the importance of place value and were lucky enough to kick start the year with our new Top Ten Maths Program, using lots of hands on materials and playing plenty of fun maths games! The second part of the term, we looked at addition and subtraction where students are continuing to work on their skills.



HASS- We are learning all about Medieval Europe & Japan and how different their lives were opposed to how we live now. Term 1, 2022 in the Senior Room is off to a flying start!

The Year 10s have settled in well to Year 10 life with new and exciting subjects on their timetables and have transitioned well into the new expectations set on them as leaders of the school.

ENGLISH - The year 10s have shown a great interest in using technology this year, we have learnt how to access our student emails (from the Department of Education) and use this platform to investigate formal and informal language. We have also learned about Persuasive texts through 'Blogs'. Each student has planned and written their own blog article on a topic of their choice. It was very interesting to read Karen's blog post on 'Pinjarra' and what it means to her.

MATHS- We have started off the year by looking at money and how to get money through employment in the work force or through government assistance (Centrelink). Utilising our research skills we have found the meaning of financial terms that they will continue to come across as we continue to explore financial responsibility throughout the year.



HEALTH—We are all very proud of the 'Relationship tree' which we have built and displayed in class. First we brainstormed and explored the different types of relationships that we have in our lives, family and work colleagues. Then we identified the characteristics that make these relationships healthy and unhealthy and added these to our tree.

ROAD AWARENESS- Preparation is underway to start the Keys 4 Life drivers education program by looking at safety in all aspects of road use- as a passenger, pedestrian and a driver.

As a class we are working towards developing our five 'Keys for Success' from the You Can Do It! Social skills development program. Our focus goal for Term 1 was developing resilience when faced with challenges. Everyone is very excited and are busy preparing for their WPL placements which should be starting Term 2. They have learned about safety and hazards in the work place and about interview techniques as they prepare to head out on a WPL interview with Mrs Lockley.









YEAR 10.2

Hello to all parents and carers. It is amazing that the first term of 2022 is almost at an end.

In 10.2 we have worked on developing our team. We have completed several activities in our Mentor sessions and are using the You Can Do It! structure to try to be kind and feel safe in our class. We have a structure to each day, supported by visual schedules and the class are becoming accustomed to the new routines. We have covered our back wall with funny pictures of the entire 10.2 team!

ENGLISH- Our class has been introduced to the world of words! We have been busy enjoying different activities involving grammar, semantics, synonyms, antonyms and sequencing. The students are able to display their impressive vocabularies during these sessions. We have been visiting the Library on Thursdays and most of the students are very interested in the graphic novels.

MATHS- It is all about numbers and time! We have worked on the fundamentals using number grids and ten frames and reviewing concepts that will help our money handling and budgeting, which is part of our ASDAN modules. We looked at the measurement of time, with calendars, digital and analogue clocks and schedules.

SCIENCE- We explored the changes in texture when we cook. The students displayed their mixing and measuring skills and to date we have made playdough, smoothies, cookies, pancakes and sausage rolls. Cooking gives us the chance to work on our social skills as we have lunch together when the cooking (and cleaning up) is done.

HEALTH- We have learnt how to keep ourselves healthy, and our thoughts, feelings and bodies safe. We have looked at relationships and how people behave. The focus has been on identifying aspects of how to keep relationships healthy.

SUSTAINABILITY- 10.2 has been allocated the worm enterprise for our Sustainability efforts this semester. We have been caring for the worms, feeding and keeping them damp and cool. Over the coming weeks, we will begin to organise the tubs to begin harvesting the castings which we will sell to the staff. This money will help pay for class excursions later in the year.

A focus this term was on preparing for Work Place Learning. We have learnt about hazards in the workplace and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). Later in the term we will be going out in the community to complete activities for our ASDAN modules, this will incorporate shopping, road safety and budaetina.

We have an arrangement with HHC to help them get ready for R U OK Day. Our class has committed to making sustainable decorations for HHC to use in their whole school activities planned for that day. We have used sticks from around the shed, and then used them to make a frame for the black and yellow decorations. We have created 47 at the moment and are planning to make at least 80 for their display.















SUSTAINABILTIY and T&E

Our school tree growing program is off and running for 2022.

We received our trays of seedlings from MOTT (Men Of The Trees) are assisting with propagation for the first time. Over the years our success rate of germination has been a challenge. However, with MOTTS help, and a small donation, they have supplied us with hundreds of seedlings.

This year, we intend to grow a wide variety of trees including tuarts, jarrah and melaleucas. We will continue with the coastal shrubs and will plant out everything during the first rains of winter.

Our aim is to plant and maintain 3000 trees each year with the help of the City of Mandurah. This ambitious goal took a slight set back with many of our trees dying over summer. Undeterred we will continue with a change to our watering methods.

All the students started lessons in the shed with an emphasis on safety and how to orientate themselves around the gardens and equipment. As sustainability is our focus they have assisted in collecting bins and auditing waste. Each lesson included a variety of tasks from filling bird baths, tending to chickens, mowing, weeding and preparing beds for vegetables. The year 7's have been able to squeeze in Mosaics and are gluing their tiles on and sanding and sealing the backing board.

Thanks to the students who assembled the new Basketball ring, with installation of the new concrete pad. All students have been enjoying the fantastic court.
